



From the Director

Our 2023 season titled Gods, Myths, and the Divine stands as a high point in the 13-year history of the Geneva Music Festival in terms of artistic quality, patron support, and community engagement. Through the exploration of spiritual beliefs that have inspired musicians across the ages, we presented a varied repertoire of music featuring both canonic masterpieces as well as less frequently performed works by underrepresented composers.

The festival continues to gain prominence in the national music scene. Our distinguished lineup of artists is second to none and featured many of the great artists of our time including Grammy ® Award winners, laureates of the Indianapolis and Queen Elisabeth International Competitions, Avery Fisher Career grant winners, faculty of eminent conservatories, and members of prestigious string quartets. The festival's recordings, regularly broadcast on American Public Radio's *Performance Today*, continue to garner a national listening audience.

Our service to community organizations has never been stronger. Through our long-lasting partnership with the Geneva City School district, we reached hundreds of students at the North Street and West Street Schools. We also performed for children at the YMCA and offered a masterclass at the St. Peter's Community Arts Academy. Making music accessible to all community members remains a focal point of our efforts, and we continue to search for the most effective ways to do so.

It remains my distinct honor to lead this tremendous organization that leaves a deep impact on so many in our community. GMF continues to be a cultural ambassador for our beautiful city and is a cultural gem of our region. I thank all of our audience members, patrons, artists, and supporters for their many contributions to our success.


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





2023 Revenue

donor management system, and procured our own sound and video-recording equipment to livestream concerts. We also hired a new graphic designer who has streamlined our concert graphic themes with the website, social media, print festival materials and our first GMF street banner.

Online, On the Air and In the Press

GMF enjoyed strong growth once more this season on its social media and digital outreach platforms, increasing its Instagram account reach by 249% and Facebook by 222.7%. GMF social media also showed significant active engagement, with increases on Instagram by 147% (followers and non-followers) and Facebook page visits by 170.7%. Instagram followers grew by almost 10%; Facebook numbers almost 700 followers and our newsletters circulate to 1,123 subscribers, with an open rate increase from 2022 to almost 50% and a click-through rate of 3-5%.


Thirteen newsletters were sent via email to subscribers, 6 articles to magazines and newspapers, and 14 concert press releases to 14 media outlets. Festival brochures were mailed to 1,010 GMF patrons. Festival concerts were announced on four radio stations, and two stations had three live interviews with artistic director Geoffrey Herd, with four artists joining for one of the three interviews. Recordings of festival concerts were regularly aired on American Public Radio's Performance Today, continuing to grow GMF's national listening audience.



May 21, 2023 Season Opener: Iris Trio Gearan Center

The Iris Trio presented a new, original classical composition – the "Blue Chapter" of their multi-year Project Earth. Connecting to the GMF 2023 season theme of Gods, Myths and the Divine, the Trio considers this project an ecological prayer of sustainability for the planet. The Blue Chapter includes stunning new works by distinguished Canadian poet Don McKay (Governor General's Award, Griffin Poetry Prize) and Junonominated composer/jazz pianist Florian Hoefner, including "Chorus of Wishes," "Kinds of Blue," and "Bird Island Suite." The Iris Trio intermingled genres and art forms, and audiences were fascinated by this inventive and beautiful opening to the season.







The first concert for GMF artists-inresidence this season was an auditory feast, as musicians performed to a full

feast, as musicians performed to a full audience, many of whom were new and first-time attendees. Focusing on the myths and legends facet of the theme, the performers explored storytelling through music with a soul-searching Schumann Piano Trio; modern classical composer Shih-Hui Chen's programmatic work Returning Souls, an eerie and ethereal introduction to the legends of the Amis people of Taiwan; and Mendelssohn's dramatic second viola quintet.

Songs of the Spirit

GMF resident artists showcased music's remarkable ability to calm the mind and uplift the soul in this concert, eliciting both serenity and joy. A raucous evocation of the festival atmosphere in *Temples in Taiwan* by Lu Yun contrasted with Maurice Ravel's "Kaddisch," a melismatic, soaring prayer from *Deux mélodies hébraïques*. The Piano Quintet No. 1 by Ernest Bloch concluded the evening with an epic study of such juxtapositions, seamlessly moving from agitation to meditation to rapture.

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In this final chamber music concert for the season, GMF artists-in-residence really demonstrated the connection and camaraderie that make the festival's musical performances so stunning. The concert was a celebration of harmony, both musical and spiritual. The pieces showcased reworkings of chorales and hymns. Variations of Bach chorales set a touchstone, and the sublime second movement of Franz Joseph Haydn's String Quartet in G Major, Op. 76, no. 1 took up this chorale style; throughout the work, the instruments set up a call-and-response. The finale, Piano Quintet in A Minor from Edward Elgar, was inspired by an older form of sacred song - the

Stunning weather set the stage for the last concert of the season – an outdoor matinee by local trio The Brothers Blue. Rooted in the fertile tradition of old-time fiddle music. The Brothers Blue create a sound all their own – a hybrid of fresh. original songwriting with elements from Country, Bluegrass, Cajun, and Irish music. Audience members were treated to a mix of traditional folk songs and original compositions as the trio sang and swapped instruments in and out.
